Beliefs & Attitudes Zone: Promise Challenge

- ✓ Investigate a political or world issue and explain your views to others on the subject
- ✓ Give freely of your time to help someone less fortunate than yourself
- ✓ Successfully run a learning experience for other Scouts

Community Zone: Community Challenge

- ✓ Take an active part in some form of local community service totaling at least six hours. The time may be spent doing a number of different projects or by showing commitment to a single project over a longer period of time. For example: running a fund-raising stall or game, or delivering leaflets.

Global Zone: Global Challenge

- ✓ Choose and investigate an international issue, e.g. health, poverty, child rights, water and sanitation
- ✓ Show an understanding of the issues involved
- ✓ Take some action as a result of that research
