Principles and Approaches

- Applies **best practice** in adult learning to maximise quality.
- Pioneering capacity building **innovations** e.g. live-streaming face-to-face sessions and including government representatives on the programme.
- Embeds dedicated content on **organisational priorities**, e.g. humanitarian action in urban contexts, gender, and early childhood development.
- Learning outcomes and content have been designed specifically for the **South East & East Asia context**.
- Pioneering **partnership approach**, jointly managing the programme across two members and developing a Partnership Terms of Reference with the Asia region.
- Our **sector-wide engagement and influence** has allowed us to enlist an expert facilitator body of 38 people from 9 organisations for the programme.
- Geographical focus followed a global scoping study and in depth discussions with the Asia region to **build capacity where it's needed most**.
- Partnership model works to embed the programme at regional level. A specially designed module including a ToT encourages a **sustainable approach**.
- The **evidence-based programme design** was built from a comprehensive analysis of existing child protection capacities and gaps in the sub-region. Extensive feedback from participants, facilitators, programme management and regional expertise will inform its revision.
